KEEP FROZEN (AKA Pochsy Productions)

KEEP FROZEN (AKA) Pochsy Productions was founded in 1992 for the company's first show, *Pochsy's Lips*, which won a loyal cult following, and went on to play theatres and festivals across Canada, the U.S.A. and in Germany.

Oh, baby (Pochsy's Adventures by the Sea, 1993) and Citizen Pochsy (Head Movements of a Long-Haired Girl, 2002) followed on. Earliest collaborators include John Turner (collaborator/director), Michael Kennard (collaborator/coach), Greg Morrison (composer), Michel Charbonneau (designer), and Sandra Balcovske (director and dramaturg) all of whom helped bring Pochsy into being.

Since then, the company has developed and produced many more award-winning performances. Under the umbrella of "Keep Frozen," the shows and the short films adapted from them have travelled from Dawson to Boston, Palm Springs to Kuala Lumpur, winning prizes and loyal fans along the way. A book of the Pochsy Plays was published in 2004, and was a finalist for the Governor General's



Literary Award (and is available at the bar!)

In 2008, "Pochsy Unplugged" offered a cabaret melange of the three plays, and filmed adaptations as well.

Hines is the daughter of scientists, and since 1992 her plays have included darkly comedic meditations on environmental peril; her performances aim to reflect North American consumer culture in what seems to be a perilous time. Combining such disparate elements as magical realism, satire and horror, Keep Frozen : Pochsy Productions has won a growing audience over the years, numerous production and literary nominations and awards, and the opportunity to creep around the globe.



Pochsy's Lips (above); Citizen Pochsy poster (right)




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KAREN HINES - WRITER & PERFORMER

Karen started out on the Fringe and emerged as the author of a number of plays which have been presented across North America at venues including One Yellow Rabbit, Tarragon Theatre, Boca del Lupo, Alberta Theatre Projects, Factory Theatre, Dallas Theatre Centre, Soulpepper, and Joe's Pub NYC (Public Theatre). She is a two-time finalist for Canada's Governor General's Literary Award, and a finalist for the Siminovitch Prize for Playwrighting. She is a Dora Mayor Moore Award-winning performer and director and has collaborated on the works of beloved Canadian theatre artists such as Linda Griffiths (Age of Arousal), Michelle Thrush (Inner Elder) and adult horror clowns Mump & Smoot (Mike Kennard and John Turner), whom she has directed since their inception. Karen has been an actor in Canadian and American television and film, and her own short films featuring the character Pochsy have screened around the world. Recent presentations include her real estate horror Crawlspace, which has toured to micro-theatres across Canada and is now available as a CBC Podcast on Radio One. Crawlspace was just translated for its spring 2023 French premiere at Théâtre Francais de Toronto, and her All the Little Animals I Have Eaten played at Edmonton's Shadow Theatre last April, directed by Alex Dawkins.



MICHAEL KENNARD - DIRECTOR

For thirty-five years Michael has been a co-creator (with John Turner), performer, and producer with internationally acclaimed clown duo Mump & Smoot, Some of Michael's directing credits include: *The Christmas Carol, The Hobbit* and *The Wizard of Oz* at The Globe Theatre in Regina. *The Hollow* at Berkeley St Theatre in Toronto. The Second City's *Family Circus Maximus* and *Insanity Fair* in Toronto and co-directed *Embryo's on Ice* in Chicago. *Half a Sizpence, Echoes, Pandemonium*, and *Alice Through the Looking Glass* at Bishops' University. *The Last Days of Judas Iscariot* and *A Glass Half Fulfilled* at the University of Alberta where Michael is currently an Associate Professor. Michael has received a Dora award (Toronto) a Sterling award (Edmonton), a Jessie award (Vancouver), two Canadian Comedy awards, a Boston Theatre award, and a Drama Logue award (California) for his work in performance, coaching, and directing.



DIANNE GOODMAN - CO-PRODUCER

Dianne is thrilled to be reunited with her favourite clown people on POCHSY IV for this production at Theatre Network, having coproduced the premiere at the One Yellow Rabbit Rodeo in January of this year. Since retiring in 2021 from 38 years with Alberta Theatre Projects, Dianne has been honoured to have been invited to join her talented friends with their productions. These include Playing with Fire in Yellowknife with Shaun Smyth, Vigil at the Belfry in Victoria with Glynis Leyshon, and most recently two shows with Making Treaty 7 Indigenous Theatre in Calgary with Artistic Director Michelle Thrush, Napi and the Rock (in partnership with the Calgary Philharmonic) and O'kosi. Dianne is the recipient of the Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of Regina, the Betty Mitchell Award for Distinguished Achievement in Production, and the Harry and Martha Award for Significant and Sustained Contribution to Theatre in Calgary. She resides in Calgary where she spends time with and cooks for her beloved family and friends, gardens, and volunteers in her community.



JOHN TURNER - CLUNIC CONSULTATION

John is best known as "Smoot" of the award winning Canadian clow duo Mump & Smoot, and until 2020, the founder and Artistic Director of The Manitoulin Conservatory for Creation and Performance (a.k.a. The Clown Farm). He now coaches, teaches, dramaturges, directs, and performs across the country. Coaching and/or Directing credits inclue Justin Miller's *Pearle Harbour, in Distant Early Warning*, Christine Moynihan's *Inside Ethel: Outside*, Jennifer Dallas' *Kittly-Bender* and *Known*, Morro and Jasp (multiple shows), Karen Hines' *Citizen Pochsy* and *Crawlspace*, Michael Kennard's *Puzzle Me Red*, Sandrine Lafond's *Little Lady*, and De-bajeh-mu-jig Theatre's *A Trickster Tales*, and *The Gulch*.


