Theatre Network is a not-for-profit professional theatre company with a 49-year history serving Edmonton audiences. We produce contemporary theatre with an emphasis on Canadian playwrights and work with local artists to provide engaging and intimate arts experiences in our home, the Roxy Theatre on 124th Street.



Our Work

Led by Artistic Director, Bradley Moss, Theatre Network is dedicated to creating work that is challenging and engaging, and unafraid to question our conceptions of the world we live in or showcase difficult conversations. Our continuing commitment is towards artistic risk; providing unexpected and exciting experiences. Theatre Network has a long history of producing work from LGBTQ2+ and Indigenous writers, and foregrounding stories of those communities

Theatre Network is proud to champion two play development programs: the Morris Foundation Fund for Commission of Plays, focusing on stories relating to mental health and addiction; and the Theatre Network Commission of Indigenous Plays.

Theatre Network presents Nextfest, a multi-disciplinary emerging artists' festival focused on supporting the work of early-career artists, and we run the TN Summer Academy for high school students each year. Theatre Network facilitates the year-round professional visual arts programming in our Miller Art Gallery.

Our Impact

Theatre Network's award-winning productions have been recognized across the country. We are the recipients of many Elizabeth Sterling Haynes Awards, including Outstanding Production of a Play for four consecutive years 2017-2020. We are known as a home for world premieres from some of Canada's top playwrights. Four of our premiered plays have gone on to be nominated for the Governor General's Award for Drama. The Roxy Theatre is the recipient of the 2023 Edmonton Urban Design Award of Excellence & the People's Choice Award.

The Roxy Theatre

Theatre Network owns and operates The Roxy Theatre. The original Roxy, a 1938 movie house, was converted into a live theatre venue by the company in 1989. In 2015, we lost the building to fire and temporarily relocated to Edmonton's Old Strathcona district. With the generous support of Edmontonians and all levels of government, Theatre Network opened the new Roxy Theatre in 2022 in its original location. Inside the Roxy is the 200-seat Nancy Power Theatre, the 80-seat Lorne Cardinal Theatre, and the Miller Art Gallery.
